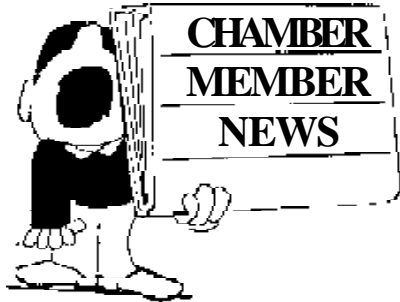

GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS

Your Chamber is part of the Northeast Indiana Chamber Coalition. Below is our rough draft list of 2006 Federal Issues:

TAXES/FISCAL POLICY: NEICC supports reducing the federal budget deficit by controlling federal spending and also supports the reduction of the federal income tax, the elimination of the estate tax, the reduction of capital gains taxes and the elimination of the Alternative Minimum Tax.

Specific legislation: Death Tax Repeal Permanency Act of 2005 (H.F. 8) – The Chamber supports the complete and full elimination of the death tax to support small businesses and family-owned businesses.

IMMIGRATION: NEICC supports comprehensive immigration reform that would improve national security and border enforcement while allowing hard-working, taxpaying undocumented workers to obtain legal status.

TRANSPORTATION: Specific project – Fort to Port. The interchange of US 24 and US 469 is not in the state's funding plan. The NEICC strongly encourages our federal delegation to continue to seek earmarks for this project so that this needed project can be completed as originally designed.

TRADE: NEICC supports measures designed to achieve and maintain a stable and competitive relationship between the U.S. dollar and the currency of major trading partners. The Chamber Coalition supports legislation that reduces or eliminates barriers that impede Indiana and U.S. commerce both domestically and abroad.

LABOR: The coalition opposes any legislation which increases the minimum wage.

SOCIAL SECURITY: The coalition supports reform of the Social Security system to include use of individual and private accounts that allow for investment in the market.
